

Terrington Parish Council

Minutes of the Meeting held on
Monday 2nd September 2019

1. Apologies

Apologies were received from Cllr Taylor

The Chairman welcomed Cllr Caroline Goodrick, North Yorkshire County Council and Cllr Claire Docwra, Ryedale District Councillor. 1 member of the public also attended

Cllr Goodrick gave us an up-date summary of matters relating to North Yorkshire County Council, including the lack of funding and Cllr Docwra discussed several items from Ryedale District Council including the local plan review.

2. Minutes

The minutes of the meeting held on 8th July 2019 were agreed as a true record and signed - proposed by Cllr Barnett and seconded by Cllr Watson – all in favour.

3. On going issues

Parking Church Lane – following much discussion it was proposed by Cllr Winning and seconded by Cllr Stockdale that a sign should be placed on the adjacent wall warning people of the dangers of parking on the footpath – all in favour.

Village Repairs

Mr Hornsey had been approached and he was able to do the repair and painting work to various items in the village. Subsequently he had started to do the work and it may already be finalised

Cemetery

Following enquiries it was noted that solar panel charging would not be possible for the electric fence.

Cllr Watson recommended a professional mole catcher and Cllr Winning would make contact with him.

4. Finance

It was proposed by Cllr Winning and seconded by Cllr Barnett to pay Mr N Fargher £223.20 for grass cutting 20018/19 – all in favour. It was also agreed retrospectively to pay £10.80 to the Village Hall for a meeting – proposed by Cllr Barnett and seconded by Cllr Winning – all in favour.

It was proposed by Cllr Barnett, the treasurer, that the Council moves to accrual accounting as this gives a more accurate picture reflecting the income and expenditure each year – this was seconded by Cllr Winning – all in favour.

5. Vandalism in the village

It was reported that there had been two incidents in the village where damage had been done to buildings and the police had been informed

6. Planning application – Jasmine Cottage

After due consideration of this application the Parish Council has some issue and whilst it does not object to the proposed use we do feel that the side large dormer is out of character and the three window dormer also overlooks at least three neighbouring gardens - a rethink of the design is suggested.

7. Community energy and heat scheme

Correspondence had been received from Spectrum Real Estate wishing to explore the feasibility of a community energy and heat scheme. The Clerk was asked to contact them asking for more information on the proposal.
